






Shoulder Assembly in Dogs

Canine Resources Manager (CRM), San Rafael, CA

Guide Dogs for the Blind has an amazing opportunity at our beautiful San Rafael, CA campus for a Canine Resources Manager (CRM). This role works in collaboration with the Director of Breeding and Canine Development to develop standards and techniques for canine training, socialization, and husbandry to be used by puppy raising and socialization staff and volunteers colony-wide and with individual dogs. The CRM will also be responsible for training and developing staff and volunteers in applying such standards.

The CRM will work with Community Field Representatives (CFRs) and other relevant staff to determine the readiness of dogs for recall into training and will counsel CFRs in the application of plans and techniques for individual dogs. Work with the Puppy Socialization Coordinator, the CFRs, the Puppy Raising Manager, Puppy Raising Administrative staff and other relevant staff to ensure that puppies placed in raiser homes are effective matches for that home. Work with these same groups and individuals to transfer puppies from a less-successful home to one with more opportunity for success for that individual puppy.

The successful candidate will be knowledgeable in canine theory and skilled in canine behavior management. A minimum of five years' experience in assessing dogs' health, temperaments and behaviors and/or conducting dog training, behavior modification, and placement with the corresponding ability to translate theory into effective dog handling.

Undergraduate degree or equitable experience required. Canine behavior certification highly desirable - IAABC (International Association of Animal Behavior), ACAB (Association of Companion Animal Behavior), CCPDT (Certification Council for Professional Dog Trainers), KPA (Karen Pryor Academy). Guide Dogs for the Blind has an opportunity for a Community Field Representative (CFR) in Southern California. Our CFRs are responsible for ensuring an adequate pipeline of puppy raisers within their territory to accommodate the number of puppies that need homes and to ensure there are enough dogs properly prepared for recall into training. This includes providing direct support, supervision, and guidance for puppy raising activities undertaken by youth and adult volunteers and recruits new raisers and leaders to assist with raising Guide Dog puppies within a designated territory. The CFR works out of his or her home, visits raisers to evaluate puppies' progress, mediates problems that arise, and actively recruits new program participants.

The CFR may also be actively involved in fundraising, marketing, outreach and other events throughout their territories with individual clubs or with Development staff. The CFR coordinates public presentations and special events within their territories; assists in identifying and developing partnerships with local community programs that are of benefit to GDB, our constituents and the community (through education and public relations). The CFR will also assist in the placement and monitoring of dogs with blind youth and into homes which will further our mission and the communities where they reside.

Candidates should have at least 5 years' experience in dog obedience or handling, knowledge of behavioral modification techniques, and the corresponding ability to read and evaluate raisers and leaders in order to give them appropriate guidance.




Remi got his Advanced Jumpers Title on March 31st in USDAA at Happy Dog Agility.




