Update on Whittier Manditory Spay/Neuter (MSN) Law

After a lengthy public hearing, the Whittier City Council this evening unanimously rejected the mandatory spay/neuter ("MSN") provisions of its proposed animal-control ordinance by adopting an amendment drafted by California Federation of Dog Clubs ("CFODC"). The second reading of the amended ordinance will occur at the council's meeting on September 8.

Like many other cities in Los Angeles County, Whittier contracts with the county's Department of Animal Care and Control for animal-control services. The city also adopted the county's animal-control ordinance nearly a decade ago, but chose to exclude the MSN provisions of the L. A. County code – provisions that would require all dogs in the city to be sterilized with few exceptions. Under the proposed update to the city's animal-control ordinance considered this evening, the city would have adopted the MSN provisions of the county.

At the hearing, representatives from CFODC, members of the fancy, and several veterinary healthcare professionals countered the proposal by offering fact-based evidence that MSN laws fail to keep dogs out of shelters, drive people away from licensing their dogs, require harsh enforcement, increase the risk of rabies to the public, can hurt our dogs' health, and specifically in Whittier, would drop annual licensing revenue by over \$80K -- and possibly much more if non-compliance matched other jurisdictions' rates.

Following the presentations, the council unanimously stated that the decision to sterilize a pet should be made by its owner in consultation a veterinarian, and not by government fiat.

This was truly a team effort. CFODC would like to thank all of you who testified at the public hearing or contacted the members of the council.

July General Meeting

We had a great turnout for our July General Meeting. It was almost standing room only at Nancy Giltner's home with close to 30 members present.

A huge thank you to Dr. Dody Tyneway for coming to our July General Meeting with her wonderful presentation on the different injuries that dogs can sustain while participating in the many activities we request of them.

She did stress that if your dog is working muscles in a specific position that the same position should be worked from the other side so that both sides of the dog are worked evenly.

She provided a presentation that showed us the soft tissue injuries that can occur and what we can do to help prevent them. She also made the point that many times we do not wait long enough for our dogs to heal. They may be running and jumping, and we think they are healed after a couple of weeks. Where in reality it may take another month or more for the dog to totally heal so that there are not microscopic tears present just waiting to be reinjured.

She also went into the dog's structure especially touching on how the shoulders are actually held together across the back with just soft tissue. Dogs do not have collarbones like we do to join the shoulder to the rest of the skeleton. In dogs they are actually free floating.

There was so much great information that was of value to all the different dog disciplines.

Thank you once again Dody for a informative and great evening.

Training Site Rules

Please remember that training on the grounds of Canoga Park Lutheran School is a privilege that has been granted to our club. In order to maintain that privilege, strict adherence to the rules outlined below is necessary. We ask for everyone's cooperation so that all club members can continue to benefit from the use of our wonderful training facility. Thanks in advance for your help and understanding!

School Rules

- VHOC members and students are allowed access to the school grounds from 6:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Please do not plan to arrive early or stay late.
- Parking within the school grounds is reserved for VHOC members and instructors. Non-member students attending the Basic Obedience & Manners classes are asked to park outside of the parking lot (there is usually ample parking on Jordan Ave.)
- Training or playing on the grass area is restricted to VHOC members and those students whose classes are held on the grass. Students whose classes are held on the blacktop are asked to potty their dogs outside of the training facility. Guests without their canine companions are welcome to observe individual training or classes.
- Everyone MUST be responsible for picking up after his or her dog(s) and disposing of all waste in the can provided by VHOC. **DO NOT TOSS ANY DOG WASTE IN THE SCHOOL TRASH CANS!** No exceptions!
- Dogs are not allowed in the planter areas at any time. Members are asked to potty their dogs along the outer perimeter of the field.
- Dogs are not allowed inside the gymnasium (or other school buildings) at any time, for any reason.
- Dogs are to be under the control of the owner/handler at all times.
- Dogs must be contained in a crate or X-pen when not being actively handled.
- Excessive barking will not be tolerated.

Students are responsible for setting up and breaking down any equipment that might be required for their class.




